

## Collaborator

**DEFINITION** The Collaborator is a Respiratory Therapist who participates in and promotes interprofessional collaboration. They highly value the contributions of other professionals. The successfully seek input from and work side by side with others to provide the best care to patients.

**DESCRIPTION** Patient-centred care is a collaborative partnership between you, the patients you care for and their families, as well as all other members of the health care team. Effective collaboration requires a fundamental understanding of, and respect for, the essential role of each member of the health care team.



### **EXAMPLES OF LEARNING ACTIVITIES**

- Rather than having a lunch and learn within your own department, extend an invitation to have speakers/ attendees come from other departments.
- Arrange for student RTs to spend as much time with other health disciplines as possible.
- Seek opportunities to actively participate in inter-disciplinary rounds, committees, etc.
