Over the past few months we've revisited the important world events of the last two decades, highlighted some of the RT profession's achievements and shared CRTO milestones of the last 20 years. In our final *Timeline Series* feature, we will look back on the period between 2010 and October 2014 – just in time to celebrate the CRTO's 20th anniversary at the INSPIREvolution Conference on November 21, 2014.

The first year in the second decade of the millennium begins with the 2010 Vancouver Winter Olympics. Alexandre Bilodeau won the first ever Canadian Olympic gold medal on our soil and Canada collected the most gold medals ever won by one country during the Winter games. Then federal NDP leader Jack Layton announces his cancer diagnosis to the public during this year, while Rob Ford is elected mayor of Toronto. Elsewhere in the world, there are three major earthquakes in Haiti, Chile and China (7.0, 8.8 and 7.1 magnitudes, respectively), causing widespread damage and loss of life. An Iceland volcano erupts, covering much of Europe in ash and grounding many flights. Greece suffers an economic crisis affecting many other countries in the European Union and Chilean miners trapped from an accident are rescued after spending 69 days underground. Popular series' *The Walking Dead* and *Boardwalk Empire* premier on TV and blockbusters *Inception, Shutter Island* and *Black Swan* hit the theatres. In Respiratory Therapy, the *Excellent Care for All Act* is passed in Ontario to support quality, evidence-based care for patients and the CRTO completes the Long-Term Ventilation Project – which is still continued today.

In 2011, a massive 9.0 magnitude earthquake off the coast of Japan causes a devastating tsunami on March 10, 2011. In the UK, a major phone hacking scandal surfaces and the Occupy Wall Street movement begins in the United States during September 2011. Apple CEO and technology guru Steve Jobs dies this year, along with North Korea's Kim Jong II and Canada's own Jack Layton. In television, *Game of Thrones* makes a popular debut along with *Suits, New Girl* and *The Voice*. Action films *X-Men First Class, Thor* and *Immortals* come to the big screen as well as critically-acclaimed *The Girl With the Dragon Tattoo*. The Canadian Thoracic Society releases Home Mechanical Ventilation Guidelines this year and the CRTO sees a change in leadership with Christine Robinson retiring and current Registrar & CEO Kevin Taylor taking over. The CRTO also conducts a comprehensive *Scope of Practice Review* and participates in national labour mobility and international applicant projects as a member of the National Alliance of Respiratory Therapy Regulatory Bodies (NARTRB).

The Mayan Calendar ended in 2012, but the world did not despite much anxiety, speculation and media buzz. The Costa Concordia cruise ship ran aground and capsized in Italy, killing many and sparking a criminal trial. The 2012 Summer Olympics take place in London, England and Spain receives a billion-euro bailout amid a financial crisis. Obama is reelected for his second term as president of the United States while the rover Curiosity lands successfully on Mars. This year marked the 200th anniversary of the war of 1812, the 60th anniversary of the CBC and the first installment of *The Hobbit* series. A great year for movies, 2012 saw the release of *Django Unchained, The Dark Knight Rises, The Avengers* and The *Hunger Games*. In the RT profession, the RTA is amended to include a Prescribed Substances regulation, enabling RTs to independently administer oxygen in certain settings. The Quality-Based Procedures (QBP) initiative is introduced in Ontario and the Middle East Respiratory Syndrome (MERS-CoV) emerges in Saudi Arabia.

In early 2013 meteorites plunged from the sky into Russia injuring hundreds and causing a lot of property damage. Later that year, Chris Hadfield makes history as the first Canadian to head the International Space Station and Justin Trudeau is elected the federal Liberal Party Leader. Beloved former South African president and international equality symbol Nelson Mandela passes away at the age of 95. Maggie Thatcher (the Iron Lady) also passes away this year, and Pope Benedict XVI resigns from his post. Other events of 2013 include the U.S. Government shutdown, super typhoon Haiyan in the Philippines and the Lac Mégantic train disaster in Quebec. House of Cards debuts on TV, along with The Blacklist and The Michael J. Fox Show. Movies Frozen, The Wolf of Wall Street, American Hustle and 12 Years a Slave become some of the most acclaimed films of the year. At the CRTO, the Conflict of Interest regulation is completed along with the Oxygen CBPG; and the website is completely re-designed and launched in Fall 2013 to better serve our Members and stakeholders.

Although there is still time for Canada's famous cold, the year 2014 has been the hottest ever on record worldwide. The XXII Winter Olympic Games took place in Sochi, Russia despite much controversy leading up to the events. Two Malaysian Airlines have been lost this year: first Flight MH370 over the Indian Ocean and more recently MH17 over Ukraine after being shot down in a conflict zone. The current Ebola outbreak in West Africa has raged all year, with almost 10,000 cases and almost 5,000 reported deaths. It is the largest ever outbreak of the Ebola Virus Disease. Popular movies this year have included Gone Girl, Fury, Guardians of the Galaxy and Edge of Tomorrow – with the highly anticipated third installments of both The Hobbit and The Hunger Games series' expected later this year. Television debuted shows *True Detective*, *Fargo*, and *The Flash* this year as well to much acclaim and popularity. The Respiratory Therapy profession turned 50 this year, the Controlled Acts regulation was amended, and the CRTO celebrates 20 years of self-regulation in Ontario.
