

Background

Changes to the CRTO's by-laws were proposed, informed by principles of good governance, and with the public interest in mind. A summary of the main changes is provided, with details available in the [December 3, 2021 Council package](#) (starting on page 413). Note that no changes in Membership fees were being considered.

Overview of proposed changes included establishing three separate by-laws: Most prominent, the existing by-law has been regrouped into three separate by-laws. This will support better organization, and a more streamlined process for updating content; General organizational changes have been made throughout, including removal of redundant language, and use of gender-neutral terms; Changes related to Council and Committees, including a stronger focus on conflict of interest; and changes that impact Members related to professional liability insurance requirements and the material that gets posted on the public register.

Consultation Feedback Details

The document was posted according to the CRTO's [public consultation process](#). A consultation survey was posted on the CRTO's website, tweeted on the CRTO Twitter account and shared with members in the December 2021 & February 2022 e-bulletin.

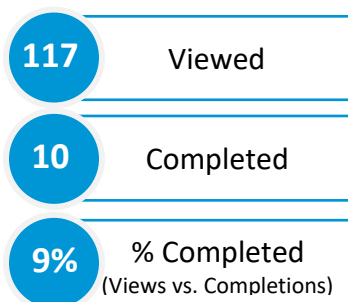
In total, 117 people viewed the consultation survey, and 10 responses were received. All respondents found the by-laws clear, understandable, and free from omissions and errors. No comments were received, and no changes were made to the by-laws as a result of this feedback.
